QUALITY OF LIFE

What are the housing options like (urban, suburban, rural)?

- A variety of housing options exist, from city apartments and townhomes to suburban neighborhoods and rural properties with open space.
- **Example:** Downtown Lancaster offers walkable city living, while Manheim Township and Lititz provide suburban options with strong community amenities.

How long is the average commute?

- Most commutes are manageable, often ranging from 15-30 minutes depending on location.
- **Example:** Employees living in suburban areas like Mount Joy or Ephrata can typically reach downtown Lancaster within 20 minutes. From the Northern most point of the County, to the Maryland line it's about 1 hour and 15 minutes total.

What are the top-rated schools in the area for K-12? Are there reputable private schools or specialized educational programs nearby?

• Public schools, charter schools, and private institutions provide strong K-12 education options. Many schools have specialized STEM, arts, or career-prep programs. It just depends on what you are looking for an education.

• A mix of public and private colleges, universities, and trade schools offer opportunities for continued learning and workforce development. Including access to in person and hybrid graduate studies and certifications.

- **Example:** Downtown Lancaster has a vibrant arts scene, while surrounding towns like Lititz offer a historic, close-knit feel.

- Yes! The region offers so much to do live music, performing arts centers, museums, and historical attractions.
- **Example:** The Fulton Theatre is one of the oldest continuously operating theaters in the U.S.

- Lancaster's community calendar is full of seasonal festivals, art shows, and food events that bring the community together year-round.
- **Example:** The Lancaster Balloon Festival draws visitors with colorful hot air balloons and family-friendly activities. Or our Lancaster City Restaurant Week is twice a year, giving people deals and discounts while showcasing restaurants.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS

What is the quality of healthcare in the area?

 Lancaster has access four, top notch Healthcare systems – three of which are tied directly to research institutions - Penn Medicine Lancaster General Health and Penn State Health of Lancaster – as well as UPMC and Wellspan Health. All of them include high-quality hospitals, urgent care centers, and specialty providers ensuring comprehensive medical care.

Are there fitness facilities, parks, or recreational activities available?

• Lancaster has so many ways to stay active – all year. Between gyms, yoga & dance studios, running trails, and outdoor adventure – you'll find something that matches your lifestyle!

TRANSPORTATION AND ACCESSIBILITY

How easy is it to navigate the area?

• The road system is designed for efficient travel, with highways, main streets, and scenic routes providing access to key locations. Lancaster County's "spoke-and-wheel" model allows easy travel between rural, suburban, and urban centers.

What are the commuting times like?

• Most commutes are 15-30 minutes, with minimal traffic congestion compared to major metro areas.

• **Example:** A commute from Lititz to downtown Lancaster typically takes about 20 minutes.

Is public transportation reliable and accessible?

• Lancaster does have bus services and has a bike-friendly infrastructure – but does not have any subway or metro system – no need!

What transportation options are available for travel outside of Lancaster?

- Regional airports like Harrisburg International or Lancaster Airport 90 minute access to Baltimore or Philadelphia Airports. While we lack internal rail system, Amtrak keeps us connected to the west towards Pittsburg, and to the east towards Philadelphia to get you to any major metro.
- **Example:** Lancaster's Amtrak station is the 3rd busiest in Pennsylvania, and 21st in the US!

- A diverse economy with strong industries in healthcare, finance, technology, and manufacturing.
- **Example:** Lancaster's job market includes major employers like Armstrong World Industries, Ultra Electronics, Turkey Hill, and more.

They often host concerts and entertainment at the stadium!
- You'll find lots of support for Philly sports teams!
- Not only do we have a national chain movie theatre, but we have 2-3 locally owned, stellar movie theatres.
- There are so many opportunities for entertainment like American Music Theatre, Sight & Sound, Fulton Theatre, Prima Theatre, and more.
